- I. L. Gregory called the meeting to order at 10:45 am.

- III. Attendees introduced themselves to the group.

- IV. A. Roth started off the session's Share & Learn: Performance Support Tools
<http://libraries.ucsd.edu/assets/elearning/performance-support.pdf>
 - a. Discussion of difference between what is "instruction" vs. "performance support"
 - b. Activity part of a larger/longer activity UCSD Librarians were doing to formulate basis for Instruction and Design concepts.

- V. R.Wiggins invited to discuss Threshold Achievement Test for Information Literacy (TATIL) field testing. [Handout provided via meeting link above]
 - a. Looking for schools to help with field testing these TATIL modules (18 different institutions participate); opportunity to try this test/measurement for free.

- b. Wiggins asks to have at least 25 students to take the test; is most interested in variations in different types of institutions—all modules are designed to be completed in a standard class hour (average about 35-60 minutes).
- c. Field Test institutions will be producing reports this summer (June 2016)

- VI. L. Gregory updated the group with SCIL Works 2016 follow-up
- a. SCIL Works offered annually to provide instruction support to librarians
 - b. SCIL is an interest group of CARL--\$40 a year/can join as many IGs as you want, no need to be a member to attend.
 - c. T. Matlin reviews what the difference is between SCIL Works and SCIL Spring Program; Business Meetings involve Share & Learn sessions but also involves running the business of the group. Matlin encourages librarians to form deep connections with other librarians in your geographic area.
 - d. L. Gregory shared evaluation data:
 - i. 65 people registered; 59 attendees; 55 evaluations returned (93% returned)
 - ii. 48 attendees were academic librarians; 1 was a hybrid academic/public librarian; 5 people didn't report what they were; 1 student scholarship winner
 - iii. Review of the actual venue & event based off evaluations indicated attendees were generally happy with program—99% rated event either excellent or good.
 - iv. Attendees were happiest with the low cost of the event and the good food—represented a good value for the event.
 - v. Suggestions:
 - 1. Lightning Rounds instead of posters would be more interesting
 - 2. Not enough time to visit all the posters
 - 3. Shorter presentations during the Research & Practice Sessions
 - 4. Social Table set-up was not conducive to sitting through sessions (but great for talking amongst each other)
 - 5. Future Themes suggestion will be uploaded to the SCIL Google Drive.
 - a. Assessment; Critical Theory; First-Year Experience Courses; Programming; More Framework; more Assessment; More Flipped-Assessment.

 - c. Lua Gregory: Dealing currently working a Space Planning Group—looking at some space planning documentation to prove the viability of library space & resources
 - d. Tricia Lantry: Hired a new Arts & Humanities Librarian – starting April 1; January had a group of San Diego High School librarians come through and collaborate with CSU San Marcos – exciting connection to determine what students are getting in HS in terms of literacy.
 - e. Talitha Matlin: CSU San Marcos having their first undergraduate research award – has up to 6 \$600 prizes; CSU Striking the Faculty – asking for a 5% raise – largest strike in California Education History

 - g. Amanda Woodward: Woodbury University: Planning all of the library's outreach events for National Library Week in April—workshop on how to cope with information overload and working on an Upcycled Books Competition where students are encouraged to transform discarded books into works of art!

- h. Zem Lee: Working on a Longform Tutorial for Evidence-Based Research is looking at resources to include in the guide—is anyone using Blackboard? And what are you using for your online etutorials to see how it translates together? Looking for tips & tricks and looking at incorporating LibGuides into the LMS via LTI integration.
- i. Allie Jordan: Recently gave a presentation at our Faculty Symposium on Mendeley, Bibliographic Management Software—working with getting Faculty to adopt it.
