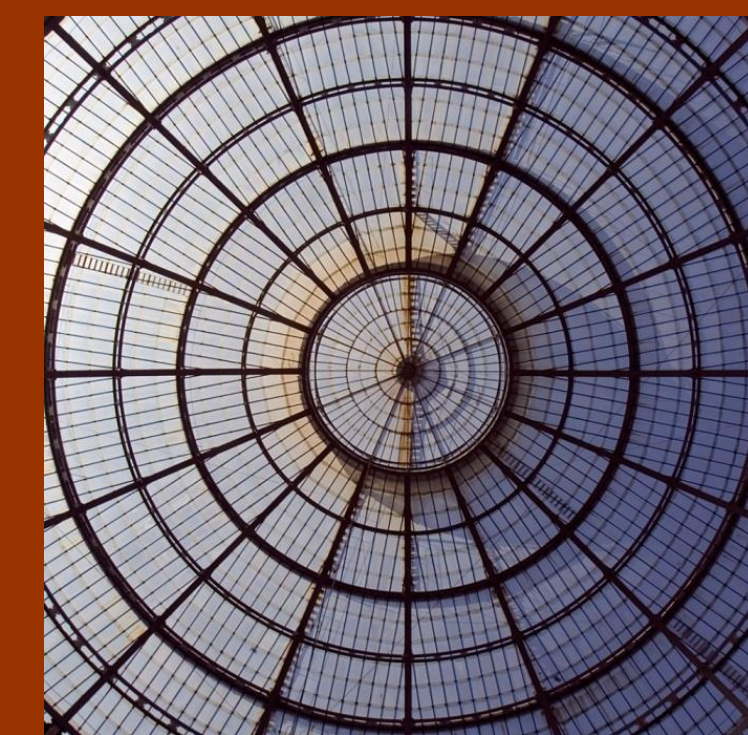
INSTRUCTION TEAM BUILDING & ENVISIONING
