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# Why is making instruction accessible important?

- People intake information in a variety of different ways
- Accessible design provides a variety of ways for people to access information according to their needs
- By incorporating accessibility measures into our services, we can better serve <u>all</u> our patrons

#### Issues with Masks

 Masks are a great tool to prevent the spread of COVID-19

But...

- Masks cover facial expressions, which are a necessary component of communication via sign language
- Masks cover lips, preventing lip reading to better understand what is being said
- Masks muffle speech

### Clear Paneled Masks

- Provide a clear window (made of PVC or Vinyl) to see lips and lower facial expressions
- However, clear paneled masks still present some challenges.

#### Acoustic Effects of Masks

- University of Illinois Augmented Listening Lab conducted experiments on how different mask types affect speech.
- Surgical masks and KN95 respirators dampened speech the least
- Clear paneled masks dampened speech the most, affecting high frequency sounds ("s", "f", "th")

# Masks and Amplification

- However, the use of clear paneled masks in combination with microphones can minimize sound distortion
- Lapel microphones work best with most masks
- Clear paneled masks with lapel microphones can increase visual cues while not sacrificing sound quality

# Other Tips

- Decrease background noise
- Repeat questions or comments from audience into microphone
- Provide captioning
- Provide audience access to presentation materials
